




'THE STAR' IS SONY'S ANIMATED OFFERING FOR THE COMING CHRISTMAS SEASON Bill Desowitz writing for Indie Wire notes that Sony Pictures Animation which "failed to ignite the box office with The Emoji Movie," is going to release The Star November 17. It is a kid-friendly retelling of the first Christmas from the perspective of the animals. It was directed by Timothy Reckart who created the Oscar-nominated stop-motion short Head Over Heels about a bittersweet, upside down marriage. Bill writes "there's only a hint of charm and beauty" in The Star's trailer.

The trailer suggests it will be marketed as a fast paced comedy with a donkey that appears to be related to Eddie Murphy's wise cracking over-the-top donkey in *Shrek*. Hopefully most kids today haven't seen *Shrek* so they will find the new donkey original and funny. Also the animation and backgrounds look like Reckart only had a modest budget to work with.

The film's voice talent adds name recognition so that may help sell a few tickets. The cast includes Gina

Rodriguez, Zachary Levi, Keegan-Michael Key, Kelly Clarkson, Anthony Anderson, Aidy Bryant, Ving Rhames, Gabriel Iglesias, Patricia Heaton, Kristin Chenoweth, Christopher Plummer, Tracy Morgan, Tyler Perry, and Oprah Winfrey.

**DISNEY SHELVES THE JACK AND THE BEANSTALK FILM 'GIGANTIC'** "Sometimes, no matter how much we love an idea or how much heart goes into it, we find that it just isn't working," said Walt Disney Animation Group president Ed Catmull.

*Gigantic*, Disney Animation's original feature project that was to have been released in 2020, is being shelved. It was being developed as an updated take on the *Jack and the Beanstalk* fairy tale, in which Jack befriends a female giant.

THE SAUSAGE PARTY DIRECTOR WILL HELM AN ADDAMS FAMILY FEATURE FOR MGM Conrad Vernon, who co-directed *The Sausage Party*, will direct MGM's animated version of *The Addams Family*. *The Addams Family* began as single-panel gag illustrations by cartoonist Charles Addams that appeared primarily in *The New Yorker*. Their popularity led to *The Addams Family* television show in the 1960s and then an animated series in

the early 1970s. The family enjoyed a revival in the early 1990s with a pair of hit movies that starred Anjelica Huston, Raul Julia and Christina Ricci.

CG animation work is underway at Cinesite Studios in Vancouver. Vernon co-directed *Shrek 2, Monsters vs Aliens, Madagascar 3: Europe's Most Wanted* and *Sausage Party.*

70 YEARS OF POLISH ANIMATION IS COMING TO THE PACIFIC FILM ARCHIVES IN DECEMBER Four different programs will be shown, Sun., Dec. 3 at 7:15 PM; Thurs., Dec. 14 at 7 PM; Sun., Dec. 17 at 7 PM and Wed., Dec. 20 7 PM. Some of the older works will be shown in 35mm.

"Polish animation under the Soviet yoke built its reputation on the clever, often brilliant ways that it defied totalitarianism without being caught by the censors. Animators became adept at the use of irony, indirection, and allegory as subversive tactics." The series includes many of the old masters like Jan Lenica, Walerian Borowczyk, Kazimierz Urbanski, and Jerzy Kucia and more recent artists who continue the experimentation and the breaking of new ground. The subject matter has little to do with Disney. What may seem to be familiar themes, female power, exploitation of the soil, the generation gap, male impotence, fear of aging, superhero fantasies, are in fact lures into the unpredictable, lyrical, and outrageous. CHARLES SCHULZ MUSEUM IN SANTA ROSA IS SAFE, BUT CLOSED TILL NOV. 5 They sent out a press release that said, "On behalf of Mrs. Schulz, the Board of Directors, and staff, we would like to thank you for all the heartwarming messages of caring and concern over the past week. Although the power has been restored to the Museum and we are no longer in the evacuation zone, air quality continues to be an issue. Once the air is stabilized, staff will begin the process of cleaning the interior of the Museum and examining and cleaning the art. Therefore, the Museum expects to be closed for at least the next two weeks."

"Through this devastating and stressful time in our community, the staff have moved us through all the necessary steps to ensure a safe evacuation of the art to securing storage for other artifacts. The stewardship of this collection is in good hands."

### THE SAG-AFTRA VIDEO GAME STRIKE ENDED The 11-month old strike, the longest in the union's history, resulted in bonuses and other gains for performers. It involved the union and 11 video game companies including Activision, Electronic Arts, Disney and Warner Bros. The chair of the union's interactive negotiating committee said, "The bonus payments we have now are significantly larger than what we had 11 months ago. The existence of additional payments beyond your session fee is in the video game world for good, both in our high-budget and independent promulgated agreements. Those are the victories that this strike has brought us." Members are protected by the disclosure of whether they will be required to use unusual terminology, profanity or racial slurs, whether there will be content of a sexual or violent nature and whether stunts will be required. Actor Crispin Freeman added "This contract is unique because actors don't share in

profits."

**UGLY NEWS ABOUT STUDENT LOANS USED TO ATTEND FOR-PROFIT SCHOOLS** Over the years this newsletter has depicted these schools in a negative light many times and now the National Center of Education Statistics reports that 52% of students who enrolled in forprofit schools in 2003 have defaulted on at least one loan. That compares to 17% for students who enrolled in a four year public institution and 26% who went to a community college. The study found that the number of loans obtained

in 2003 that were fully paid off was about 20 to 24%.

'ANIMATION IS FILM' IS TRYING TO BROADEN AMERICA'S UNDERSTANDING THAT THE MEDUM IS MORE THAN FANTASY FEATURES FROM HOLLYWOOD The festival was held in mid-October in LA. AIF was founded by Eric Beckman, the co-founder and president of GKids. He organized the festival in collaboration with the Annecy International Animation Festival, *Variety*, and ASIFA-Hollywood. Bill Desowitz wrote in Indiewire.com, "After 20 years of success with the New York International Children's Film Festival, Beckman thought it was time to broaden the appeal in Hollywood with an emphasis on global production and distribution. Additionally, the festival will feature studio events, special screenings, a shorts program *Songs of Love and Death*, and a VR lounge."

"The Breadwinner, directed by Nora Twomey of Cartoon Saloon (The Secret of Kells), and executive produced by Angelina Jolie and Beckman, concerns a strong-willed young Afghan girl who poses as a boy to help her family survive under threat from the Taliban."

"Mary & the Witch's Flower, the debut film from Studio Studio Ponoc, founded by Studio Ghibli producer Yoshiaki Nishimura (When Marnie Was There), and directed by Hiromasa Yonebayashi (When Marnie Was There) explores a young girl's rite of passage with a fly-by-night glowing flower and a broom that comes to life."

### **Showcasing Global Diversity**


"Non-GKids films in the competition include *Big Fish* & *Begonia*, a surreal Chinese fantasy directed by Liang Xua and Zhang Chun *Tehran Taboo*, a German/Austrian political drama directed by Ali Soozandeh; and *Virus Tropical*, a Colombian coming of age drama directed by Santiago Caicedo."

"Big Fish & Begonia is 'one of the most mind-blowing things I've seen to come out of China,' said Beckman. It's a crazy, mythological adventure about the world of humans and the world of immortals that look after humans."

"Of *Tehran Taboo*, Beckman said, 'It's one of the more adult films at the festival and tells a story that needs to be told in animation because, if this were live-action, it might be a little too provocative. It deals with this contrast between a very religiously conservative, patriarchal society and this underworld that lives in the same city. And how breaking taboos is a way of life for these people and a form of emancipation for women."

"Meanwhile, *Virus Tropical* bears similarities to *Persepolis*. It's based on the graphic novel by Power Paola about young women surviving during the Columbia drug wars, 'It's a do-it-yourself, black—and-white style, done in a matter-of-fact way, with a refreshing point of view,' Beckman said."

'AWAKING BEAUTY: THE ART OF EYVIND EARLE' IS AT THE WALT DISNEY FAMILY MUSEUM THRU

**JAN. 8, 2018** Their current major exhibit honors Earle who is best-known as the lead stylist for Walt Disney's classic feature *Sleeping Beauty* (1959) and for concept art that shaped such enduring favorites as *Lady and the Tramp* (1955) and *Peter Pan* (1953).

Also included are lots of impressive stylized landscapes, works that he sold at his art gallery in Carmel. They were sold as fine art and as postcards, reproduced in publications, etc. He also created sculptures. It is an impressive tribute to Earle with over 250 works on display.

SEE AN IMPRESSIVE STEREO 3D EFFECT ON YOUR COMPUTER'S FLAT SCREEN A friend sent me a demo of *Protanopia*. It shows a comic book being held in somebody's hand and as the cover is tilted the figures move with the one in the front overlapping one further back. The book's vimeo page says, "*Protanopia* is a digital comic for Ipad and Iphone, created as an experiment into the possibilities of digital comics.

Using elements from 3D and 2D animation in a realtime game engine it creates a unique visual style, whilst still having a familiar feeling." When seen without movement you see flat 2D artwork. Andre Bergs, the artist, has a website, but is vague about how the illusion was created.

**DISNEY RUNS 'FAIRY TALE WEDDINGS'** They can make your Disney lovers' wedding dreams come true. A 7 part TV series (info-commercial?) will debut next spring. Apparently this business is 25 years old.

**DISNEY'S 'BAYMAX RETURNS,' IS AN HOUR TV SPECIAL.** It will premiere Monday November 20 followed by two episodes of *Big Hero Six: The Series*. It all starts at 8 p.m EST.

A WANDA EXECUTIVE REAFFIRMED THEIR HOLLYWOOD AMBITIONS Zeng Maojun, president of the conglomerate's film division, he is one of Chinese billionaire Wang Jianlin's top deputies, flew to LA to address Hollywood executives at a closed-door meeting in late Sept. He reassured his many Hollywood partners that Jianlin remains committed to the entertainment business. He spoke at the AMC Century

City 15 cinema which Wanda owns. The purpose of the event was to allay concerns among Hollywood heavyweights that Wanda might be retreating from its ambitions in the U.S. film sector because of recent Chinese government scrutiny of its overseas investment activity.

The U.S. industry has good reason to wonder where Wang's Hollywood strategy currently stands. "After snapping up trophy assets at a blistering clip," Wanda and other Chinese conglomerates, including Fosun International and HNA Group, have come under heavy scrutiny in Beijing over their high debt loads and expensive deals. The government is concerned about perceived risks to the Chinese financial sector so Chinese regulators apparently are understood to have instructed China's state banks to suspend all new lending to the conglomerates' offshore acquisitions including Wanda-owned Legendary Entertainment and AMC Entertainment.

Meanwhile two major Chinese Investors have unload their stakes in Wanda's Legendary Entertainment. Wanda had to buy back two companies' investments in his troubled Los Angeles studio (worth \$237 million).

When Wanda acquired Legendary in a landmark \$3.5 billion deal last year, the conglomerate offered Chinese investors a piece of the action. At the time Wanda said it intended to merge Legendary with its publicly traded Wanda Cinema Line unit, which was

expected to generate a windfall, as Chinese entertainment stocks were red-hot then. Wanda promised investors a 15 percent return if it failed to bring Legendary public within 12 months. They didn't so Wanda has had to buy back their investors' holdings. Wanda's merger plans for Legendary have been derailed.



MARK SWIFT IS SET TO PRODUCE 'THE CROODS 2' FOR A 2020 RELEASE. Joel Crawford, who most recently served as head of story on *Trolls*, will make his feature directorial debut on DreamWorks Animation's *The Croods 2*, which is set for release on Sept. 18, 2020. Additionally, Mark Swift, who most recently produced DWA's *Captain Underpants: The First Epic Movie*, will produce it. The first *Croods* grossed \$587.2 million at the

global box office.

FEMALE ANIMATORS DEMAND END TO SEXUAL HARASSMENT IN OPEN LETTER: "THIS ABUSE HAS GOT TO STOP" The letter has 217 signatures, 200 are individuals in the animation industry. The open letter insists the must be an end to sexual harassment in the workplace. About 12 women accuses Nickelodian's Chris Savino, the creator of the animated series *Loud House*, of sexual harassment, unwanted advances and inappropriate behavior. The letter notes that women make up 23 percent of the industry's union employees and that the silence from management about harassment and assault has got to stop.

The animators' letter concludes, "We resolve to do everything we can to prevent anyone else from being victimized. We are united in our mission to wipe out sexual harassment in the animation industry, and we will no longer be silent."
